The Doxology – For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now and forever. Amen. *What does this mean?* We can be sure that these petitions are acceptable to our Father in heaven and are heard by him, for he himself has commanded us to pray in this way and has promised to hear us. Therefore we say, “Amen, Yes it shall be so.”

Confirmands Only 1 John 5:14,15 – This is the confidence we have in approaching God: that if we ask anything according to his will, he hears us. And if we know that he hears us — whatever we ask — we know that we have what we asked of him.
